What is an Aphorism?

- 1. Aphorisms are short, brief sayings. These are similar to:
 - proverbs
 - morals
 - slogans on t-shirts
- 2. They can be divided up into various topics and categories.
 - altruistic saying: altruism—concern for the general well-being of others
 - cynical sarcasm: cynicism-skepticism towards another's actions or thoughts
 - · scientific fact
 - religious parable
 - advice about successes in life or how to avoid failures
- 3. Aphorisms are often clever or witty sayings that define or explain some aspect about a selected topic.
- 4. People often use these for speeches or to spark general discussions and debate.

In-Class Exercise

- 1. Students form two or three rows.
- 2. Each student recites aphorism from Poor Richard's Almanac then attempts to toss paper ball into thrash.
- 3. If student makes basket he/she can sit down, but if he/she misses, then they have to go to the end of the line and repeat.
- 4. All twenty aphorisms will be recited.

When creating your own aphorism, construct a t-chart. On one column list topics related to one subject. In the remaining column, list possible thoughts or philosophies that you could connect with your main ideas.
