## Five Reasons Whitman & Dickinson Influence Modern Poetry in America

Walt Whitman's and Emily Dickinson's overall experimental styles serve as a means of promoting American writing and establish a new structure for American poets to follow.

- Both poets utilize a strong sense of individualism within their works. They both stress the
  importance of being a diverse, distinct personality within the growing population of American
  society.
- Both utilize *intense* personal observations of the human condition: Whitman explores the
  concepts of the average American working class, whereas Dickinson promotes the worthiness of
  the then unacknowledged female intellect.
- 3. Both utilize unique and *unexpected* techniques and elements of poetry. As a result, they both experiment with the overall presentation of a poem. For example—

<u>Whitman:</u>	Dickinson:
free verse, no rhymes	folk ballad stanzas, slant rhymes
lack of strict meter	controlled, unusual patterns of meter
long, extended lines; long poems	short lines; short poems
public, celebratory orations	intensely private, inward reflections

- 4. Utilizing metaphysical themes, both poets often question preconceived notions of morality, immortality, and humanity's placement within the universe.
- 5. Both poets provide unique views and interpretations of experience within American society.
