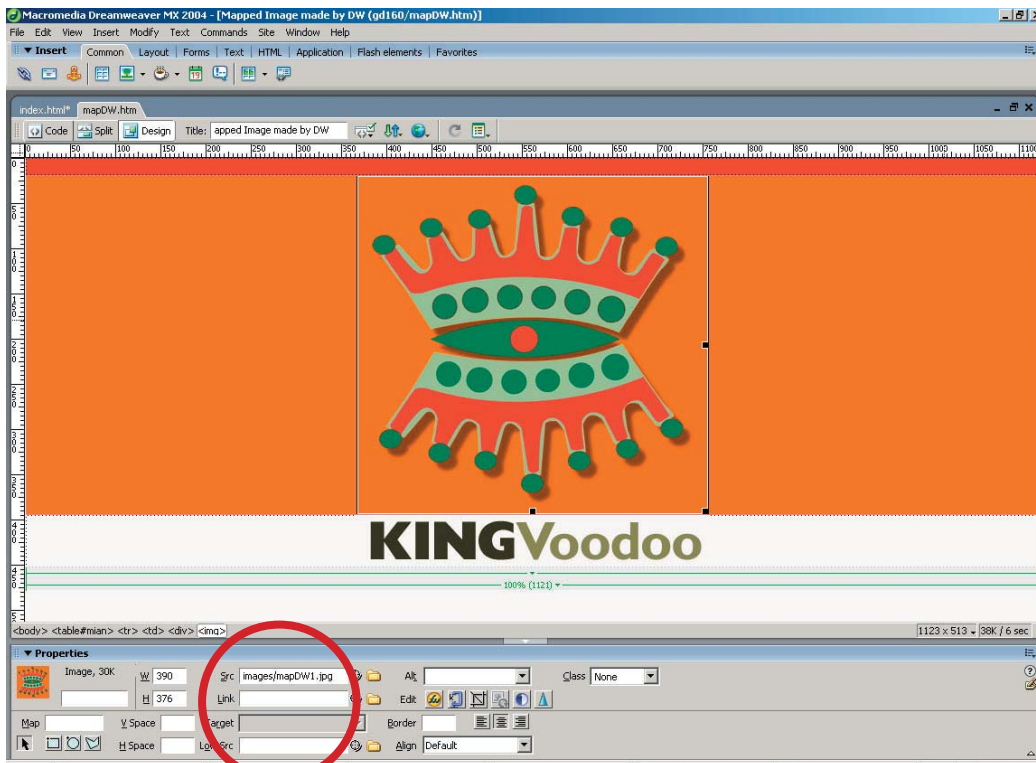
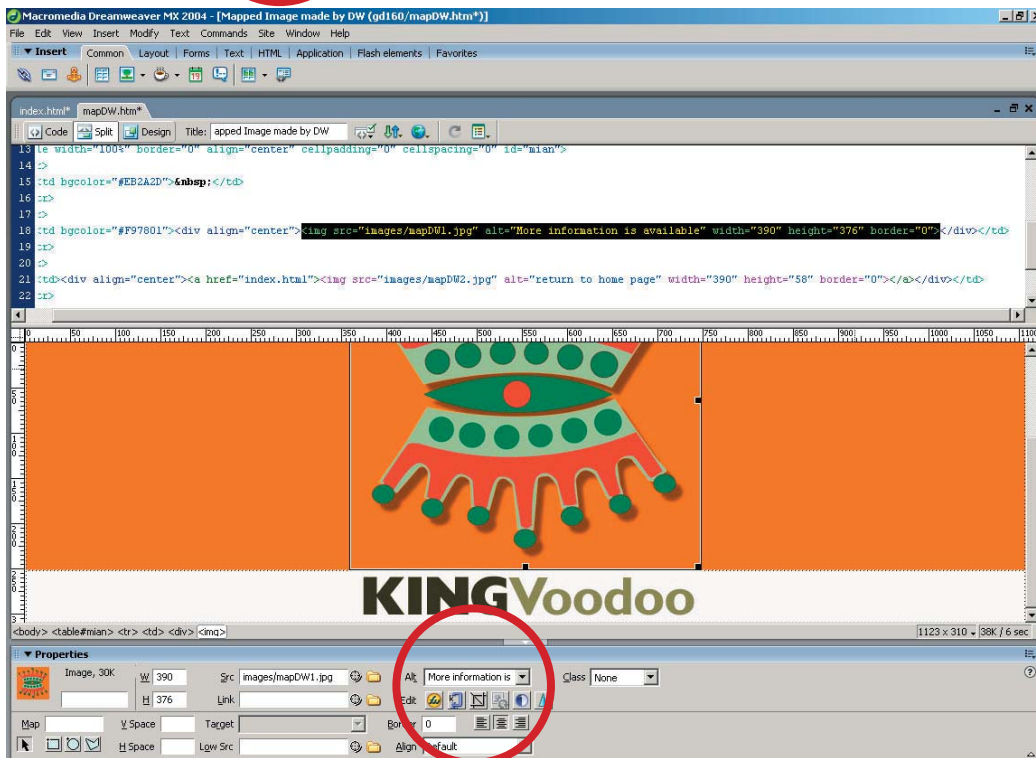


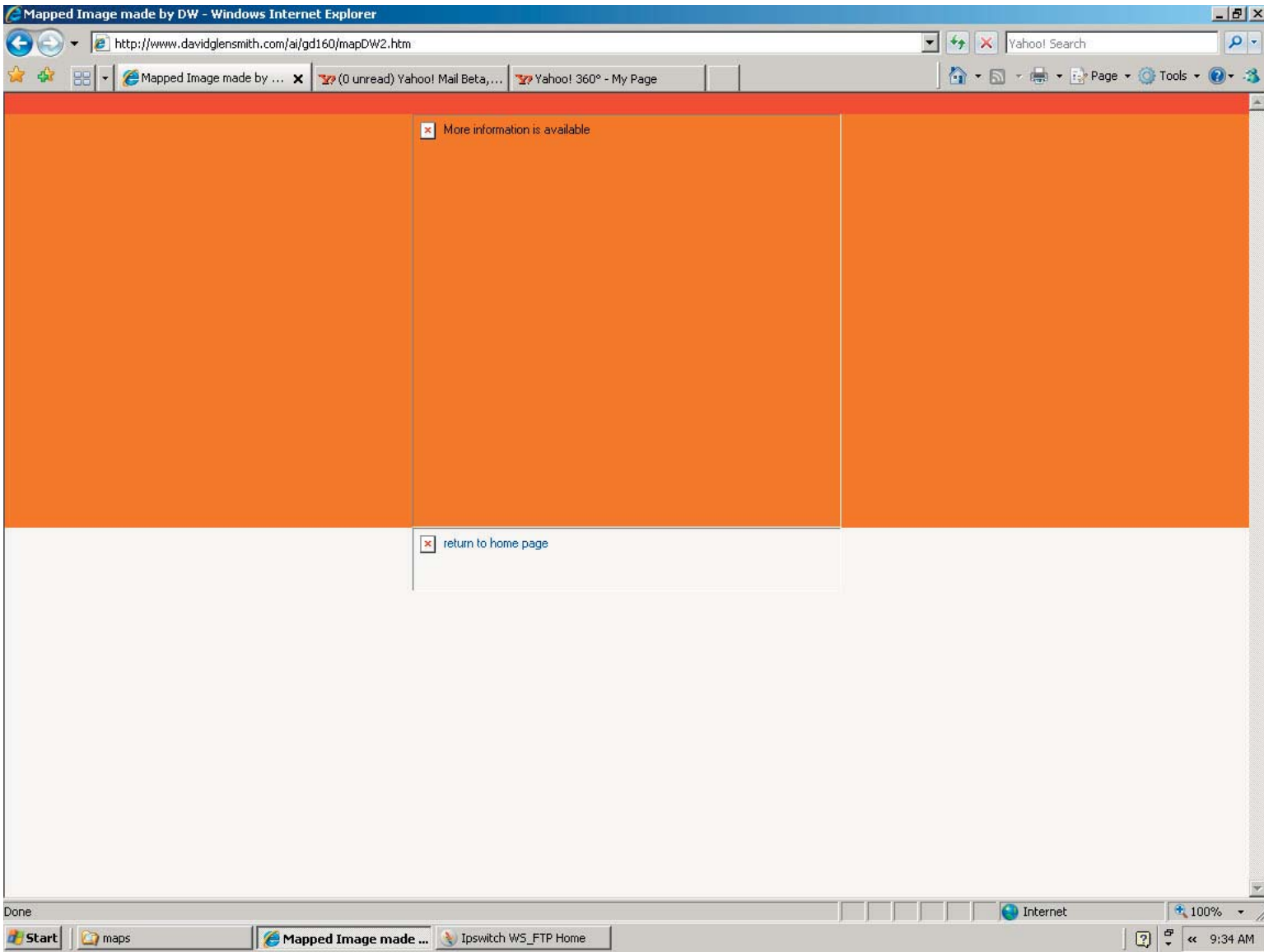
Generating Maps in Dreamweaver

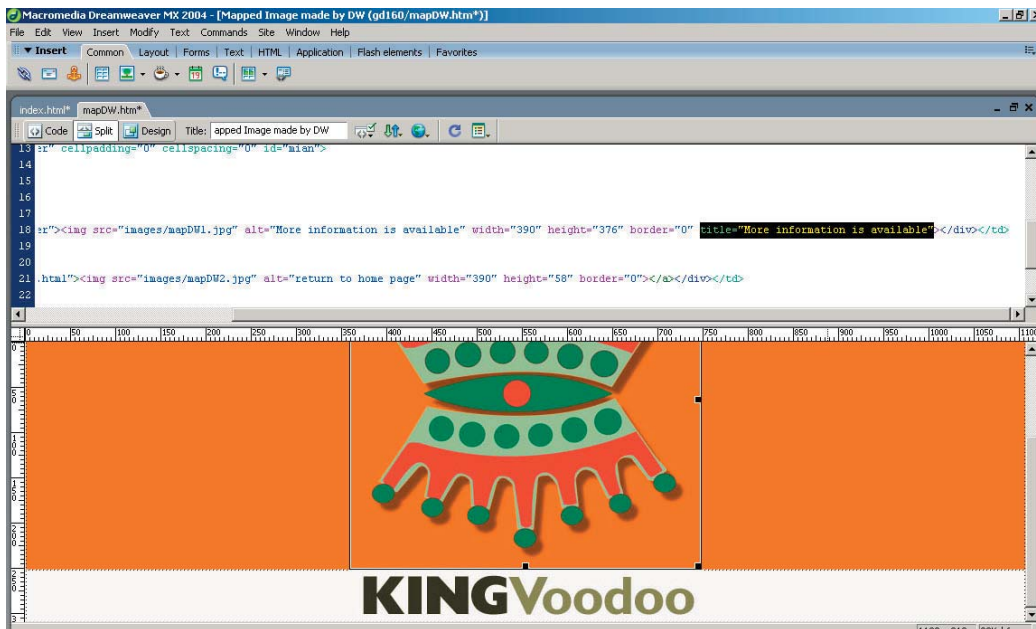


Any image, once placed into a Dreamweaver table design, can be made into a link.



The alt field will generate a message banner whenever a viewer scrolls across an image. This is essential for communicating with your viewer and for additional marketing tactics.





Mac designs do not support <alt> information. You MUST insert <title> information in order for message banners to function.

- Select image with <alt> code already given.
- The image will be highlighted in the code.
- Add to the code:
title="Message banner information."

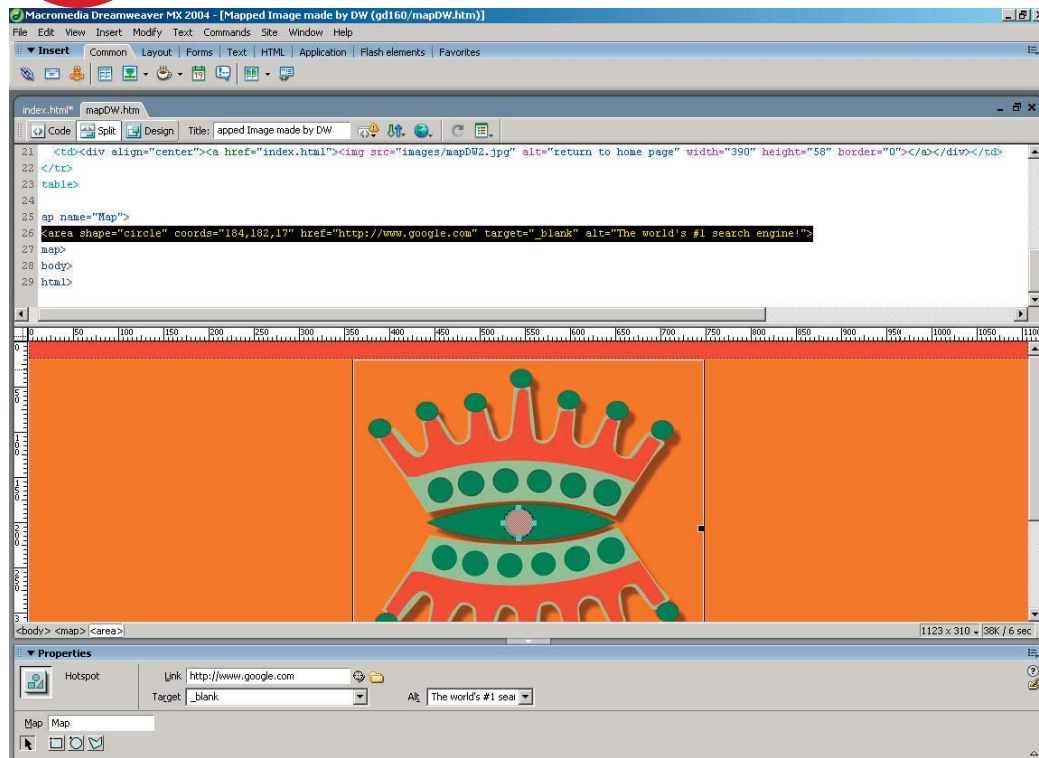
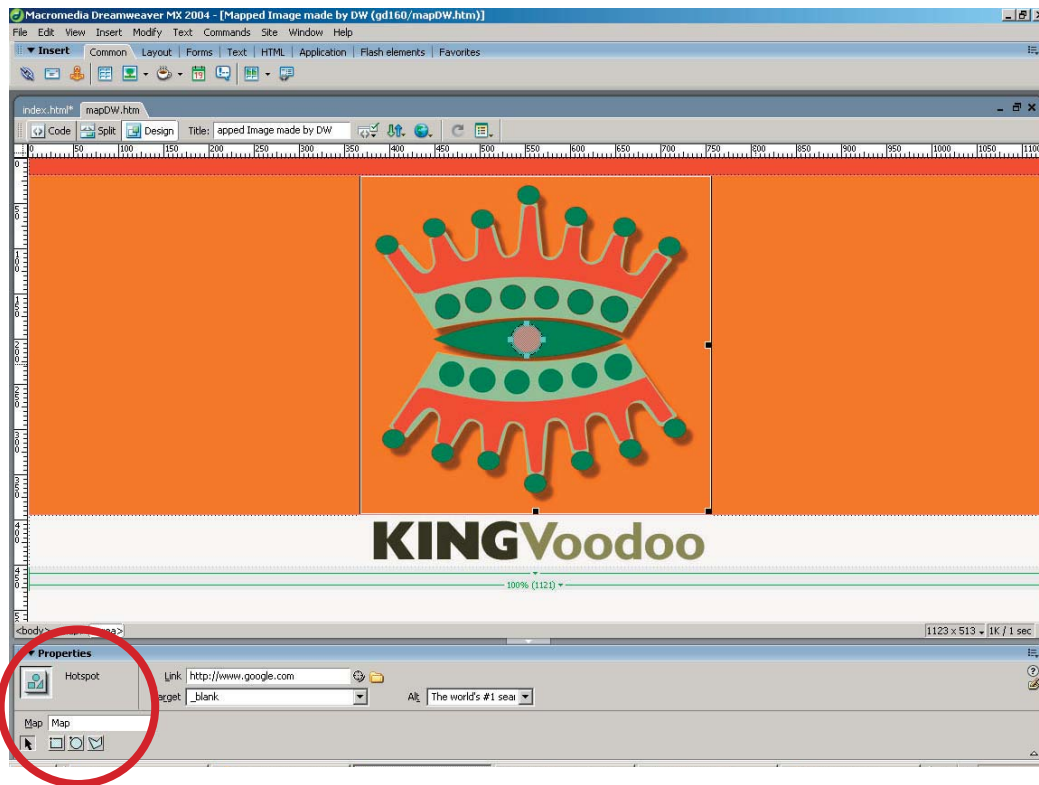


So in this screen capture notice the bottom banner image has been given a relative link back to the index page and has supplied alternative text information.

For the larger image, instead of making the entire logo into a link, various elements of the crown can be made into "hot spots" or "maps" by using the bottom right tool options in the property inspector.

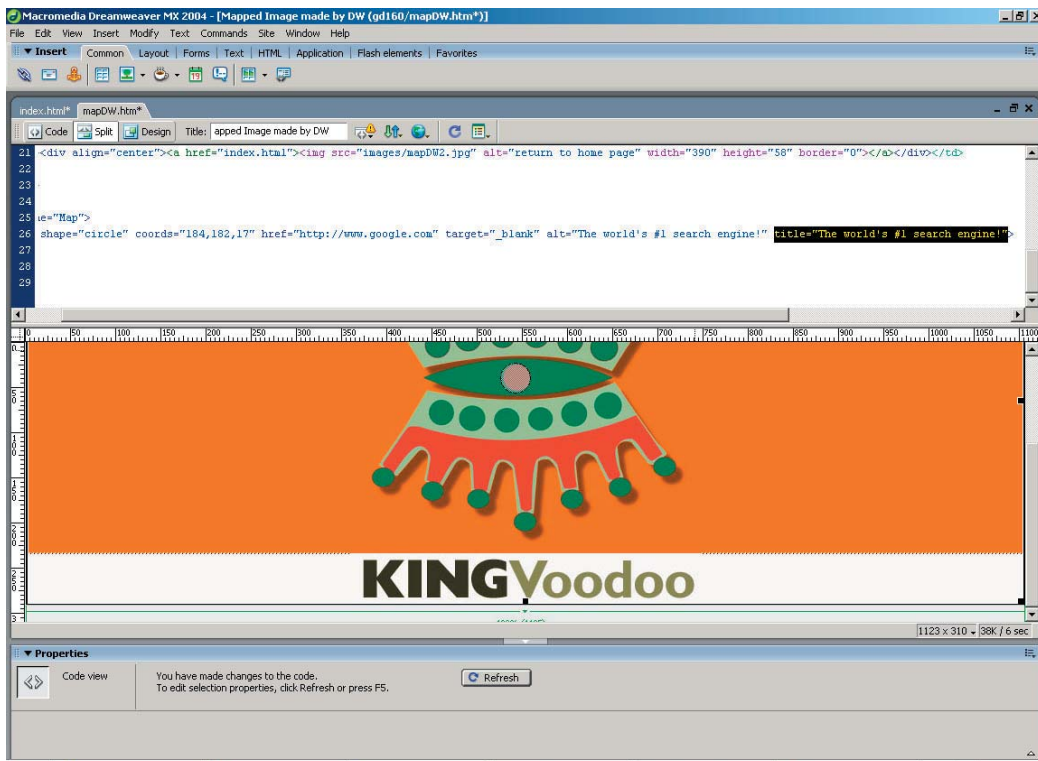
You have more than one option for generating a map: rectangle, circle, or polygon.

Once an icon is selected the property inspector changes to show you mapping controls.

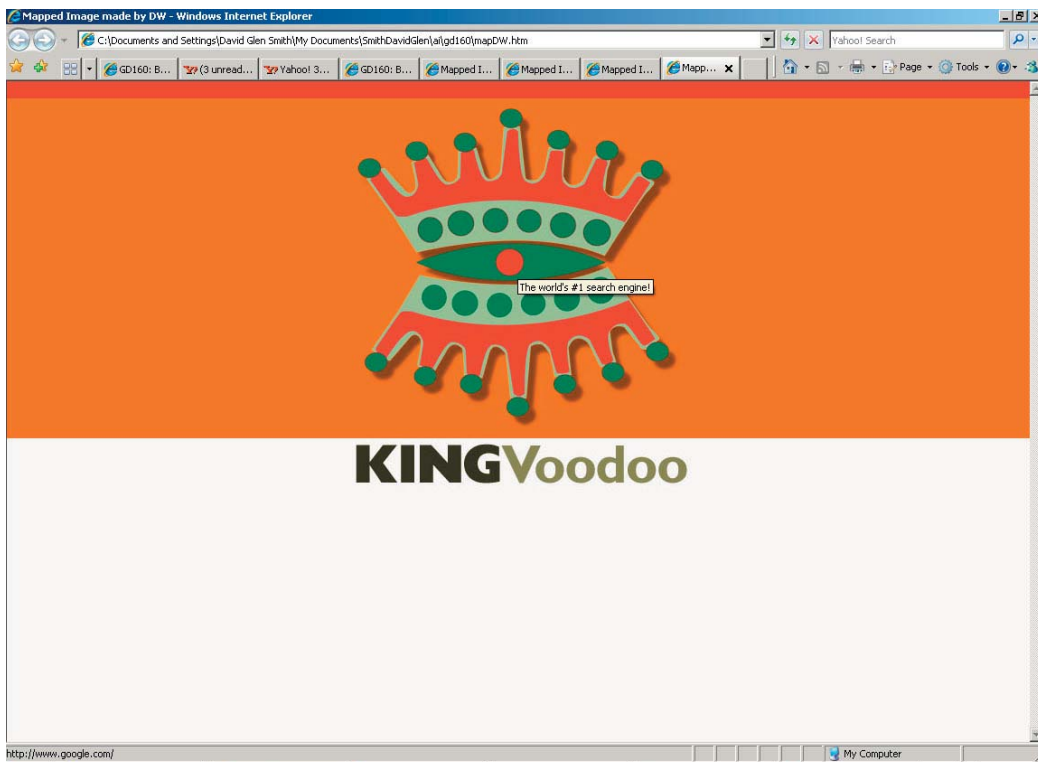


And once again, once you make an alternative text information, you will need to go to split view and add title tag information to the code.

The program will highlight in code whatever is selected in design mode. BE CAREFUL not to deselect the map when you switch to split view.



Insert the necessary title tag information just as with any image.



A message banner should appear, even in preview.
