

HTML Codes

This project will reinforce your understanding of how text-heavy designs can be controlled through the use of HTML tags.

A second feature of this assignment stresses the importance of utilizing typographic embellishments to make a text-heavy document look interesting.

For part 1, follow the demo in class, & recreate Shel Silverstein's poem as a web page. Establish each verse with its own web-friendly color, and provide embellishment of keywords. Strategically place copyright symbol (©) within layout. Give the document appropriate title in the <head> tags.

DEMO: step-by-step guide:

01. Open <http://stu.aii.edu>.
02. Enter your student web account, click on My Web Site, select File Manager, and then open /public_html.
03. At the base of the page find Create New File. In the space provided, type zoo.html.
04. Select Create.
05. Using the codes supplied, recreate the poem verse by verse. Be sure to establish embellishments to key phrases in the text. Keywords should appear in bold or italic. Some words can appear in larger type size as well. Experiment with creating diversity in the individual lines. Be sure to utilize proper codes for body copy, headlines, and copyright symbol.
06. Save the HTML codes, then preview the "live" published page. Do not preview the document in the student server programs.

project:

01. Open Course Folder and find folder "project02-HTML" and open "project2.doc".
02. Utilizing HTML codes embellish the supplied song lyrics.
03. Place the title, artist, and each verse in their own unique paragraph tags.
04. Add color to key words, or phrases, and add embellishments to the verse.
05. Save document as project02.html and title it "GD160 HTML Code Project".
06. Preview in browser and take screen capture. [key shortcut: apple + shift + 3]
07. Print and turn in page with your name.
