

Paragraph Development

Various techniques exist for construction of paragraphs.

Paragraph Development by Detail

Using a refund deposit on glass and plastic items would encourage recycling. Already such states as IA, CA, and MN have successful refund programs. When residents in these states turn in glass and plastic items to recycle centers, they receive cash as a reward.

Paragraph Development by Comparison/Contrast

Simplifying the recycling process helps motivate people as well. In a Texas subdivision called WindCrest, residents use a central–designated area, with various bins to collect items. Another community in Texas hires a curbside company to pickup all items on a weekly basis. Both neighborhoods gained favorable results.

Paragraph Development by Chronology

The general public grew aware of ecological concerns in the early sixties with the publication of a book titled: *Silent Spring*, written by Rachel Carson. A decade later, through the environmental movement, recycling centers progressed across the country in various locations. In the eighties actors and musicians campaigned for legislation to curb pollutants by careless industrial plants, paving the way for further means of recycling.

Paragraph Development by Spatial

The Arbor Day Foundation established a concept called Tree City USA. This idea enables various cities to earn the right to promote themselves as green zones. Burlington, Vermont during the last 13 years, gained the honor of using the title. Chicago, Illinois made the list during the last 26 years. Whereas Longbeach, California made the list for only 1 year.
