## **O**BJECTIVES

- At this stage of the paper, *quantity* is more important than *quality*. In fifteen minutes you should develop as many ideas as possible, filling out a full sheet of paper with possible alternatives for your paper and examining your ideas before conducting research. Explore why your opinion is established as shown on the paper.

  - Paragraphs are fully developed with clear purpose.
  - Each new paragraph includes a strong transitional phrase.
  - Include strong topic sentences and secondary evidence.
  - Every body paragraph needs at least 1 quote to support your opinion.
  - Use five <u>or more</u> sentences per paragraph.
- 5. Utilize correct grammar & sentence structure. (2 pts. per sentence error, up to 10 points)
- 6. Punctuation is used correctly. (2 pts. per punctuation error, up to 10 points)
- 7. Spelling is correct; no evidence of typos. (2 pts. per word, up to 10 points)
- 8. Works Cited page is provided and set-up correctly. (10 points)
- 9. Exercises are due 10.10 uploaded into Angel. (10 points)
- 10. Despite the fact it is a persuasion piece, avoid excessive first person, singular. (10 points)
