- Use full sentence format: roughly 300 words. *Do not use outside research*.

## <u>Answer the following questions:</u>

- 1. What is the author's primary intentions and/or themes? What mood is the poem?
- 2. What is the secondary "deeper meaning" theme?
- 3. State why you like (or why you do not like) the poem: be very specific and *cite examples, point out specific lines or words* which confuse you
  - describe details which helped you relate (or not relate) to the poet speaker
- 4. Does the verse have an obvious rhyme pattern? (tell me what words rhyme)
- 5. Does the verse contain obvious meter? (count out the basic meter)
- 6. What obvious images or sensory impressions does the poet use?
- 7. What casual observations do you have regarding the poem?
