- 3. Why would Woolf choose a moth as a subject, rather than use the other creatures which appear in the text? (For instance, the horses or the rooks.)
- 4. When does the speaker begin identifying with the moth?
- 5. What overall message does Woolf want you to understand about life?

You are required to respond with at least two-three detailed sentences per question.
