- 6. What is his topic sentence to this essay?
- 7. What organizational arrangement is he using in this essay?
- 8. In what manner does paragraph 5 lend support to his observations?
- 9. Often Staples resorts to figurative language and elaborate descriptions:

"discrete, uninflammatory distance between us" (1)

"a vast, unnerving gulf" (2)

"language of fear" (3)

What purpose does such phrases achieve?

- 10. Why do you think he ended the essay with specific classical music references?
