- 2. Knowing Miller's past works (notably *The Crucible*), how do you think his beliefs are expressed through "Get it Right"?
- 3. Look at paragraph 2: what does he mean by this statement? Look at paragraphs 17-19. What do these statements say about Miller's opinions regarding the general viewing public?
- 4. Looking at the overall strategy of the essay itself, is this organized using an *emphatic* approach or a *chronological* approach?
 Does the essay serve as *instructional* or as *informational*?
- 5. What qualifies this as a process essay?
- 6. What is his topic sentence to this essay?
- 7. Why does he use Shea Stadium as setting for executions in paragraph 4?
- 8. In paragraph 9, Miller uses the word "phalanx"—what does it mean? How does this shape his opinion in the essay?
- 9. Why does Miller keep his paragraphs terse, short, and often one sentence?
