
The Works Cited Page



Works Cited Page

The works cited page exists as a listing of references which exist in the body paragraphs of the research paper. *Every entry on this page should reflect a quote or paraphrase used within your paper*. (See *Bedford* p 571-572.)

- The list is set up in alpha-order by last name of author.
- If no author is available, the title of the work itself or the web entry title is used. (Use the first word in the title, other than *A*, *An*, or *The*.)
- Do not use the phrase "anonymous" or "unknown"—this is considered wrong.
- The proper presentation of each entry is called a *hanging indent*.

Works Cited Page

- A sample template exists on page 588 in the *Bedford*.
- There are eleven different types of entries here.
- Each type of technology has its own unique presentation to help distinguish the different types of resources
- Furthermore, on pages 530-531 of the *Bedford* is displayed a catalog of different situations which may occur when quoting sources of material.
- Whenever you come across an unique situation, refer back to your book to tell you what to do.
